# MESSAGE FROM THE COLAGE BOARD

I am thrilled to join you again this year at Family Week! We all find our way to Provincetown and Family Week for the first time by different circumstances; some come via word of mouth from a neighborhood friend, some find their way to Family Week via a Google search or Facebook post. For me, I found my way to Family Week by accident, on vacation with my moms in 1997. They forced me to go up to a table at Bas Relief Park surrounded by teenagers, telling me to "go make new friends." As an awkward teen, I resisted at first, but little did I know that the conversations that started around that table began my introduction to Family Week, to COLAGE programming, and to the incredible community of people that join annually in this tiny town for a one-of-a-kind week. That was 22 years ago. Family Week allows our families to be seen and validated; for us to connect and learn; and for youth, to engage with their peers about their own unique and amazing experiences growing up in an LGBTQIA+ family. I know COLAGE and Family Week changed my life in 1997, and continues to do so for many first-timers who then come back year after year. There really is nothing like Family Week!

As many know, COLAGE began to transition last year at this time into a merger process with our longtime partners and friends at Family Equality. Our COLAGE Board, staff and volunteers worked side-byside with the incredible staff and Board at Family Equality to manage every aspect of our merger. Our merge together to become one organization serving our families has already provided tremendous opportunities for youth participants of COLAGE programming, and for parents and allies to see what this strong community offers. I am so grateful to the Family Equality team for welcoming Kaley Fry, Director of COLAGE Programming, onto the Staff Team and for welcoming the COLAGE Board members as liaisons and partners in our shared mission.

COLAGE founders created the organization as a way to celebrate and make space for the unique experiences and voices of people with LGBTQIA+ parents and caregivers, which had previously been largely invisible in the broader LGBTQIA+ movement. While LGBTQIA+ families have again faced tremendous injustice across the country, COLAGE programming continues inspiring and empowering youth to be proud advocates for themselves and others. In this political moment, COLAGE is working harder than ever to resist discrimination and support COLAGEr youth and adult children. Coming together for Family Week offers the opportunity for COLAGErs, and their parents and caregivers, to celebrate the power and resilience of our community.

Thank you to all attendees and families here this week in Provincetown. We believe our ongoing battle to build community, and to empower, COLAGErs has never been so crucial. We wish you a week full of joy, respect and so much love!

# FAMILY WEEK CODE OF CONDUCT

### **OUR VALUES**

Family Equality and COLAGE affirm all people and celebrate our different and intersecting perspectives and identities including, but not limited to, age, culture, ability status, ethnic origin, sex, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, family composition, serostatus, nationality, race, religion, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, and citizenship status. We are continually taking steps to become a more supportive and accessible organization that values diversity and incorporates justice and equity into all of our actions and policies. We know that such an effort takes intentionality and feedback and that it is an ongoing process. Thank you for your support.

Family Equality and COLAGE advance these values under a shared vision: that all LGBTQ+ families and people with a LGBTQ+ parent/ caregiver live in communities that recognize, respect, protect, and value them.

### CODE OF CONDUCT

Family Week is a time when we celebrate, value, and respect the diversity of our community and our families. In the spirit of equity and accessibility for all participants, we ask attendees to commit to the following guiding values:

- Be respectful of all families attending Family Week and the right to self-identify.
- Be aware of your potential privileges in different areas and use them to support other attendees.
- Ask people of all ages for permission before taking their picture or including them in your video. "Photo-Shy" badges are also available at registration for any attendee who does not wish to have their photo taken.
- Ask people their name and pronouns and address them as such until they inform you otherwise. If you don't know a person's gender pronoun, use their name until you confirm with them. Tip - use gender-neutral language like friends, grown-ups, kiddos, partner, family for all occasions.
- Ask for consent to touch other attendees of all ages. This includes, but is not limited to, hugs, high-fives, handshakes, and other forms of physical contact.
- Listen to transgender and gender nonconforming people's needs and stories when they are volunteered, but respect privacy and boundaries by avoiding unnecessary questions.
- Understand that everyone has a right to use the accommodations that they need without being criticized or questioned. Do not assume someone's ability status or individual needs. This includes everyone's right to choose the bathroom they feel most comfortable using with the exception of accessible bathroom stalls. Please refrain from using accessible/ larger stalls if you do not have access needs, and leave space for those with disabilities to use the restroom.



- Do not pet, offer food to, or interact with service animals such as guide dogs in any way, including questioning their use or purpose.
- When speaking to someone using a sign language interpreter, address the person you are speaking with, not the interpreter. If an interpreter is not present, you can use pen and paper or a cell phone to communicate through text to ask the person their preferred method of communication and use it.
- Religious identities are valid and personal. Ask for consent prior to inquiring as to someone's religious identity and practice. Attendees may share about their faith, spirituality, philosophy of life, or choice to refrain from religion as they are comfortable, and so long as they do not proselytize.
- Engage one another in dialogue, honor consent and bodily autonomy, and use nonviolent and restorative practices for conflict resolution.
- Recognize that the intentions behind your words and actions may not always match up with the impact that these words and actions have. Do your best to course correct and apologize, rather than defend your original intentions.

### WHAT TO DO IF THE CODE OF CONDUCT IS NOT BEING FOLLOWED

If you have questions, concerns, or need assistance regarding access, please contact a Family Equality (in orange) or COLAGE staff member (in blue).

If you encounter someone not abiding by the Family Week shared values and code of conduct, please alert a Family Equality or COLAGE staff member.

You can also contact Amanda Winn, Chief Program Officer (ahoppingwinn@ familyequality.org), Emily McGranachan, Director of Family Engagement (emcgranachan@familyequality.org), or Kaley Fry, Director of COLAGE programming (kfry@familyequality.org) directly.

Together we will discuss the situation and take steps to address it.

### **UNDER 18 WINNER: INANNA, AGE 9**

In my experience having LGBT parents benefits you for the most part because it makes you really think, and because it makes you try new, and different things. But on the other hand having LGBT parents is a disadvantage because you can get teased or bullied for it. These are three reasons why having LGBT parents benefits me for the most part.

My first reason why having LGBT parents benefits you is that it really makes you think before you speak. I believe this is true because I have been bullied by other people (with straight parents), so I want to make people feel comfortable, and not like they have a bad family, or they aren't right. All because I was bullied for who my family was. This is my first reason why having LGBT parents benefit me.

My second reason why having LGBT parents benefits me is that it's helped me try, like, and do more things. For example, without having lesbian parents, I probably wouldn't like rainbows, I wouldn't go to pride, and probably many more things that I'm not thinking about at the moment. I do enjoy all these things, but without having lesbian parents I wouldn't get to experience all these amazing things. This is my second reason why having LGBT parents benefits me.

My first reason for why it is a disadvantage to have LGBT parents is that you can get bullied for having a "different", or "wrong" family. For example, I have had to bring fights to teachers because people were bullying me. Once, they even prayed for me to get a dad. That really made me feel bad, and at first I was really mad at my moms, but then I realized that that was just who they were. That does not mean that it isn't wrong for other kids to tease me, but now I have put it behind me, especially because we moved away. This is my last reason why having LGBT parents is a disadvantage.

### **OVER 18 WINNER: CARISSA, AGE 18**

"How could my best friends forget about me?" I watched an unfamiliar look of confusion and anger cross my mom's face when I asked this seemingly simple question after kindergarten one day. Later that evening, we discussed how my best friends 'forgot' to invite me to their birthday party; it wasn't until years later that I learned the real reason I was not invited. Their mom ludicrously believed that, because my parents were two women, my family hated fathers, and that my family was a situation to be avoided. I will never forget the pain I heard in my parents' voices as they told me this, and they will never forget the devastation on my face. What I had thought was forgetfulness had actually been ignorance. I never talked to my "best friends" again.

Growing up with two moms, I was never far from ignorance. In school, I got all the questions. Constantly. "Who's the mom and who's the dad?", "Did your dad die?", "How were you born?" It turned out that I was, and still am, the only person in my grade with LGBTQ+ parents that are out. Although there was acceptance from some, certain situations -- like when my sister switched schools due to incessant bullying, or when many families in our neighborhood stopped pretending to be tolerant after years of closeted homophobia -- made being a part of a nontraditional family feel more difficult than special.

Two years after the incident with my so-called friends, my family found ourselves in Provincetown, Massachusetts for its annual LGBTQ+ Family Week. Nothing in Medway, Massachusetts had prepared me for what I found in Provincetown. The rainbow flags flying high and proud, two men or two women unapologetically holding hands, the confidence, the prideful grins on the face of every person in town: it was unlike anything I had ever seen before. The uniqueness and diversity of the town had me staring in amazement and, later, sobbing the whole way home. I didn't know it yet, but this extraordinary town had inspired a change in me.

Every summer for the past 10 years, we have traveled to Family Week, and I have participated in a program called COLAGE. During my first year in COLAGE programming, we introduced ourselves; I remember being ecstatic to share who I was. I was overwhelmed by the comfort, relief, and belonging I felt as I shared and listened to everyone's stories of diversity and perseverance. We talked about struggles we face, the power of our community, how to change the world. Each year became more rewarding than the last: I started off in elementary school programming discussing school issues, and now, as high schoolers, we discuss topics such as socioeconomic inequality, political issues, and how to take important action in our own communities. I have gained more confidence, education, and friendship from one week each summer than I have anywhere else. I am thrilled to be a facilitator in training for COLAGE next year and to educate that next 7-year-old girl who stares at Provincetown in wonder.

Being a member of the COLAGE community has turned me from an alienated and confused child into a warrior, a fighter for the rights of all marginalized people. The LGBTQ+ community will always be my home base, but fighting for the rights of all other minority groups is my strongest passion. I have walked proudly in powerful events such as the Women's March, Black Lives Matter marches, and March for Our Lives. I have canvassed for politicians whom I believe will make important changes. I see hatred and ignorance as an opportunity to educate people. The COLAGE community I am blessed to be a part of has created the part of myself I am most proud of, and I am ecstatic to continue this important work that I care so deeply about when I enter college.

# HOPE BERRY MANLEY LEADERSHIP AWARD WINNERS

The Hope Berry Manley award honors outstanding leaders whose contributions showcase commitment to uplifting and supporting initiatives that are by and for youth & adult children in LGBTQIA+ families.



### JEAN AZAR-TANGUAY

Jean is described as a dedicated individual who has demonstrated her leadership skills by excelling through COLAGE's Youth Leadership Track and supporting other youth leaders along the way. Jean joined COLAGE at Creating Change 2019, a national LGBTQ+ conference, to present her research findings about youth in LGBTQ+ families aimed to help LGBTQ+ kids and families in schools. She teaches others to join her in upholding the dignity and respect all people deserve, especially LGBTQ+ people, in the face of injustice, homophobia and bigotry. Jean lives in Boston, MA with her two dads and younger brother. She will be attending the University of Richmond starting this fall and plans to pursue a career in medicine.



### **TONY HYNES**

After spending time in foster care for the first few years of his life, Tony was adopted by his parents Mary and Janet in the mid-1990s. Tony writes about his experiences growing up as both a transracial adoptee, former foster youth, and as a child growing up in a same-sex headed household in his memoir "The Son With Two Moms." Today, Tony is an advocate for families like his, serving as a former member of the Board of Directors for Rainbow Families, an organization devoted to promoting the rights of LGBTQ families everywhere. Tony has also been invited to be a speaker at conferences on adoption throughout the nation, especially those involving transracial adoptions. In the fall of 2016, Tony was awarded a full scholarship to begin his Ph.D. studies in Language, Literacy, and Culture at the University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC), where he has begun work on his dissertation, which focuses on racial connectedness among transracial adoptees. Additionally, he co-facilitates the Transracial Adoption Group (TAG) at FamilyWorks Together along with Master Clinical Trainer, Erica Moltz, MA, NCC.



### DRAGONSANI (DRAGO) RENTERIA

Drago is described as a leader, advocate, historian, social justice/LGBTQ activist, superb role model and inspiration to all who meet him and or are impacted by his work. Drago founded the national Deaf Queer Resource Center (DQRC) in 1995, which he still runs today. The DQRC provides resources, support and connects Deaf queer folks around the world. He also started the National Deaf LGBTQ Awareness Week project, furthering outreach and inspiring countless of Deaf LGBTQ youth. Drago is originally from El Paso, Texas, and came out at the age of 12. His mother is a lesbian and one of his two siblings is gay. Drago resides in San Francisco with his partner of 18 years, Jennifer Mantle, and their genius furkid, Magnus the Magnificient.

### **ABOUT HOPE BERRY MANLEY**

This award is presented in honor of COLAGE founder and trailblazer Hope (Berry) Manley July 22, 1969- June 21, 2018. Hope was the daughter of a gay man and a lesbian, a "bothie." She was a queer femme, a political junkie and activist, a mom to daughter Lila, a long-time ASL interpreter and active member of LGBT deaf communities. Hope took her personal history, and together with her fierce sense of justice, outrage and a strong community sensibility, she helped transform to our nation's concept of family. Hope founded COLAGE, formerly known as Just for Us, in 1990, together with Ali Dubin in Los Angeles. Hope's vision of creating a network of engaged children and young adults working together to support each other, fight homophobia & transphobia, educate and transform society, continues on today through COLAGE programming around the country and the world.


